Debussy's groundbreaking use of atonality and impressionistic harmonies and Crumb's mastery of extended piano technique demonstrate the ongoing evolution of classical music, pushing the boundaries of what is possible on the piano and what can be expressed through the instrument. This program celebrates their visions of grandeur and the profound impact they had on the trajectory of classical music.
